

“Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in him” (Psalm 34:8).



God’s Word teaches the real presence of Christ’s body and blood invisibly in, with and under the bread and wine for the forgiveness of sins. We take seriously the spiritual care of those who commune at our altar. The Word of God states that no one offend against Christ and His Word by denying His true presence and its promise and seal of forgiveness. Because those who eat and drink our Lord’s body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm (see 1 Cor. 11:27–29), and because Holy Communion is a confession of what is taught and believed at this altar (1 Cor. 11:26), any who are not yet instructed, in doubt or who hold a confession (beliefs) differing from that of this congregation (that is, belong to another church body or denomination) and yet desire to receive the Sacrament will have to first speak with the pastor before communing.

General Pantry Needs - all can be deposited in the marked hallway bin - pasta, rice, jarred/canned sauces, soup, canned meat, prepared meals, canned vegs, condiments, spices, etc. For the late spring and summer months, we are also focusing on the following, which are best if purchased/donated no earlier than the week before Pantry.

- ***Fresh produce*** (apples, oranges, potatoes, onions, etc.) - please consider donations from your own garden!
- ***Meat/protein*** (hot dogs, sausage, chicken, turkey, ham, ground beef/turkey/chicken, etc.)
- ***Dairy products*** (butter, margarine, milk, yogurt, etc.)

Adult Personal: soap, dental care, deodorant, shampoo, lotion, body wash/soap, shaving items, combs, etc.

Adult Hygiene: wipes, diapers (all sizes), underwear, socks, feminine hygiene products, etc.

Baby Items: wipes, diapers (all sizes)

Household Items: cleaning supplies, dish detergent, paper towels, TP, sponges, laundry supplies, etc.

Pets: canned food for dogs and cats

Clothing & Coats: new or gently used, clean clothing - men's coats and jackets, shirts, pants, sweaters, sweats, shoes, etc.; women's coats and jackets, tops, blouses, sweaters, fleece, pants, skirts, dresses, shoes, etc.

Handbags (Adult, Men's & Women's - nothing too large): new or gently used purses, backpacks, duffle bags, soft-sided
